



CONQUEST
Large Saloon
 1953 - 1957

This car owes little to its predecessor the Consort, being the first in a new generation of Daimler cars. The contemporary advertising majored on the cars safety features. There were a number of variants over its production run, including a saloon, a coupe and a roadster body available. The name came from the pretax price of £1,066! The car was allegedly developed in 4 months from a Lanchester 14.

SPECIFICATION.

Layout: 4 door 4/5 seater saloon with a steel body on a separate chassis. Front engine with rear wheel drive.

Engine: A straight 6 cylinder engine of 2,433cc capacity, bore & stroke 76.2x88.9 cc. Push rod operated overhead valves, Compression ratio 6.6 to 1. 75 BHP at 4,000 rpm. Single Zenith down draught carburettor.

Transmission: Four speed pre-selector gearbox, with direct third and overdrive fourth. A Daimler fluid flywheel with a final Hypoid bevel drive, giving 17.4 mph per 1,000 rpm.

Suspension, Steering, & Brakes: Front:- Independent by laminated torsion bars and telescopic dampers. Rear:- semi elliptic leaf springs with telescopic dampers. The steering is by Bishop cam and the brakes are Girling hydro mechanical drums.
